The open house session is also a time to find your child's classroom and meet their new teacher for this year.

I hope to see you on August 29th, and if not then on September 3rd, our first day of school. In the meantime, I hope you are able to continue to enjoy these days of summer.

## SCHOOL DAY SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR 2013-14



Changes have been made to the 2013-14 school calendar to continue improving quality instruction and overall student achievement while maintaining student instructional hours above the state minimum requirements. The district has restored five waiver days, returned to a 180-day school calendar, and will implement a weekly 95-minute early release on Wednesdays to support better instructional outcomes. For Sunrise, this means that the **school day for the full day Kindergarten and grades 1 through 6 will be 9:00 am to 3:25 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday**. Students can be on campus at 8:40 am when we have playground supervision, and there will be a bell at 8:55 am to remind students to get to class. Students should be in their seats, ready to start the learning day at 9:00 am. **On most Wednesdays, the school day for full day Kindergarten and grades 1-6 will be 9:00 am to 1:50 pm**. If there is a holiday or non-student day in a week, then the **Wednesday** schedule will be 9:00 am to 3:25 pm. A district calendar is attached at the end of the newsletter to help with planning.

**The half-day Kindergarten is scheduled to be a four-day program, and will begin at 9:00 am and dismiss at 12:15 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday**. There will be no half-day program on **Wednesday**. This is consistent with other Northshore half-day Kindergarten classes.

**Elementary goal-setting conferences for the 2013-14 school year will be held October 7, 8, 10, and 11** for all elementary students. The schedule on those days (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday) will be 9:00 am to 12:05 pm for full day Kindergarten and grades 1 through 6. Half-day Kindergarten will not meet during this week. **Elementary conferences will also be held February 6 and 7, 2014, for families whose students need additional academic support**. The district will also move from a trimester to a semester grading schedule this school year. Progress reports will be issued to families in November and April. Report cards will be issued at the end of the semester in January and the end of the school year in June.

## **FREE AND REDUCED PRICE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH**

Parents whose family income falls within specified guidelines set by the U.S. Department of Agriculture should apply for free or reduced-price meals for their students. Applications are sent to all families at the beginning of the school year. The cost of a reduced-priced breakfast is free to all students who qualify. Lunches served to students in Kindergarten through third grade who qualify for reduced meals will also be free. Preschool and 4th through 12th grade will be charged 40 cents. **PayPAMS Service:** The PayPAMS program accepts Mastercard, Discover and VISA. **PayPAMS will charge a processing fee of \$1.95 per payment transaction.** The school district does not accept credit card payments via the food service phone number. Fees are not charged when a family pays by cash or check (made out to the Northshore School District) at school. The first time you contact PayPAMS, you will be asked to register your information and choose the student(s) you wish to link to your credit card payments.

## NEGOTIATING THE PARKING LOT

In an effort to minimize the traffic hassles the first week of school, we would like to recommend the following:



1. If you plan on coming to school with your child the first day, be sure to bring your patience and cooperation.
2. Whenever possible and weather permitting please walk. Parking is limited.
3. If you decide to drive, please drive slowly and cautiously, as there will be many excited children who may not be as careful as we'd like.
4. Follow loading zone guidelines. When you drive your child to school, please help us keep the loading area running smoothly and safely:
  - **Drop students off and pick them up at the flagpole. Please pull forward as far as possible.**
  - **School patrol members will be on duty to assist with opening and closing car doors.**
  - **Move ahead when the car in front of you moves ahead.**
  - **Please do not wait in the fire lane or the handicapped stalls.**

## MEDICATIONS TO BE GIVEN AT SCHOOL

Detailed information follows in the "From the Nurse" section. **It is very helpful to have the medications and forms dropped off at school prior to the first day**, so they can be reviewed and approved.

**If your child has a life threatening health condition, to maintain accordance with state law, the Health Room must have doctor's orders and medications prior to a student attending school.** Generally someone is here in the office M-F, 8-4, throughout the remainder of August.



## From the Nurse



Here at Sunrise we care about the health of our students and are pleased to include a part time Registered Nurse as well as a School Assistant in our Health Room. The focus of the Health Room includes maintaining a healthy learning environment, teaching independent health habits, and supporting the psychological and physical well being of our students, families and staff. When your child visits the Health Room, they will be cared for confidentially and respectfully. Parents will be contacted, as the Nurse, School, or Office Assistant deems necessary.

- If you have concerns about your child's **physical or mental well being** at any time during the school year, please notify the nurse.
- If your child has a **life threatening health condition**, to maintain accordance with state law, the Health Room must have doctor's orders and medications **prior** to a student attending school.
- **Medication** given at school requires written permission from both the physician and the parent whether over the counter or prescription. Medication must be in the original, labeled container, with no more than a 30-day supply. Forms and details are available on the district website under Northshore Medication Policy, which can be found in the Health & Safety section. (See above)
- It is the parent's responsibility to have an updated **immunization record** on file **before** the first day of school.
- If your family is currently experiencing **financial hardship**, please consider contacting the nurse. Many resources are available in our community (i.e. medical, vision, dental, food, clothing and counseling). As always, your information will be kept confidential.
- **Illness:** Please keep your child at home during and 24 hours following a fever over 100.0° F (off medication) and following a vomiting illness. A child with cold symptoms, disruptive due to excessive coughing, inability to contain secretions, or the child feeling too ill to concentrate at school without medication should stay home as well. *Specific conditions may exclude students from school for extended periods of time; please check the Health Room website for direct links to the PHD.*
